

Property History

Formerly known as the John Walter Harris House, this 2½-storey brick home on Edmonton Street in Winnipeg was designed in 1902 by Colin Campbell "Cam" Chisholm and built by William Brydon and F. Powell for \$6,500. Its first residents were James Walter Harris and his wife, Susan. Over the years, the house underwent slight renovations and was converted into office space in 1977 by William Hanuschak and Associates Limited. The renovations included the installation of new insulated thermopane windows, new central heating system with two furnaces and two a/c units, and a complete electrical upgrade. It is now a municipally-designated historic site. The impressive building makeup consists of a full two course (2wythe) brick bearing exterior walls lined with 2x4 framing.


Edmonton Street reflects Winnipeg's growth and urban development, particularly during the late 19th and early 20th centuries. Floor Plan



FIRST FLOOR



Floor Plan


SECOND FLOOR
